

## **Erwin Tan**

Erwin J Tan currently serves as the Director of Senior Corps and Strategic Advisor for Veterans and Military Families at the Corporation for National and Community Service. Dr. Tan is a board certified Internist and Geriatrician. Prior to joining the Corporation, Dr. Tan served as an Assistant Professor of Medicine at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine where he was an attending physician at the Division of Geriatric Medicine. He was also a researcher at the Johns Hopkins Center on Aging and Health where he was a co-investigator on the Baltimore Experience Corps Trial, a five-year randomized controlled trial of the health benefits of older adult volunteering and a case controlled trial of the academic benefits for children who have older volunteers in their classrooms.

Dr. Tan also served as a White House Fellow from 2003-04 as a Special Assistant to the Secretary of Veterans Affairs. Dr. Tan was also previously a member of the San Francisco Department of Public Health's Bio-Terrorism Working Group, and a faculty member at the University of California, San Francisco School of Medicine where he developed a case management program for frequently admitted patients. He completed a Geriatric Medicine Fellowship and a Primary Care Internal Medicine Residency at the University of California San Francisco.

Dr. Tan graduated from New York University School of Medicine as a member of the Alpha Omega Alpha honor society. He received a B.A. from Brown University where he participated in the Tougaloo College Exchange Program and studied for a semester at a historically black college in Jackson, Mississippi. Dr. Tan was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the United States Army Chemical Corps from Providence College ROTC, and was trained in nuclear biological and chemical warfare.
