APPLY NOW TO THE COMMUNITY FELLOWS M.A. PROGRAM

What is the Community Fellows Program?

Community Fellows work for a participating nonprofit or governmental agency for fifteen hours per week while taking classes towards a Masters degree in Environmental Policy Design, Political Science or Sociology. Fellows receive academic credit for their agency work, allowing them to earn their Masters degree in one full year of work and classes. Fellows focus on completing projects identified and designed by the agencies.. Community Fellows pay for a total of nine credit hours. *All other tuition costs are paid by Lehigh University and the partner agency.*

How Do I Apply?

Students apply directly to the M.A. program in Environmental Policy Design, Political Science or Sociology and should submit a letter of application to the Community Fellows Program describing relevant experience or skills they may bring to the program, any specific areas of interest in nonprofit or governmental work they may have, and what they hope to learn through community work as a Fellow. Students who are admitted to one of the M.A. programs may then be selected for the Community Fellows Program in which they will be matched to an agency, contingent on availability and mutual interests. Applications are accepted until mid-May for the following year.
